

The Australian Department of Health and Aged Care has written to inform us that the Review of the Medical Research Future Fund's Cardiovascular Health Mission (CVHM) is underway.

CSANZ Member are invited to participate in this public survey to gather views on the CVHM and cardiovascular and stroke research in Australia.

The survey can be accessed here: **CVHM Review Stakeholder Survey** and will close on Monday, 24 June 2024.

The Review aims to assess progress made under the CVHM and to inform future investments. Policy by Proxy has been contracted to undertake this Review, which is expected to be completed by the end of 2024. The findings will be made available in a public report.

CSANZ Cardiac Devices Masterclass | 23 - 24 AUGUST | MELBOURNE

The Masterclass for implanters will be held on 23-24 August 2024.

The CSANZ Cardiac Devices Masterclass is an educational symposium run by the University of



Melbourne Mobile Learning Unit in conjunction with CSANZ. The Masterclass sets out to improve patient outcomes for CIED patients in Australia and New Zealand by providing practical, independent, expert-level teaching; combining state-of-the-art didactic lectures with invaluable hands-on sessions.

The inaugural Masterclasses, one for clinicians/ device implanters and one for allied professionals and nurses, were held in 2023. Both sold out within weeks and feedback from delegates was overwhelmingly positive with 100% saying they would recommend to others and 89% saying they would book again in the future.

For 2024 the 2nd CSANZ Cardiac Devices Masterclass for Implanters will again combine talks by leading experts from Australasia with dedicated practical sessions. 
ESC CONGRESS 2024 | CSANZ TRAVELLING FELLOWSHIPS ARE NOW OPEN


